Alice Cooney Frelinghuysen is the Anthony W. and Lulu C. Wang Curator of American Decorative Arts at The Metropolitan Museum of Art. She graduated from Princeton University and received an M.A. from the Winterthur Program in Early American Culture, and then began her career at The Metropolitan Museum. She has curated, published, and lectured widely on a variety of decorative arts topics, including ceramics, glass, 19th-century furniture, and all aspects of the work of Louis Comfort Tiffany.

In 2014 Ms. Frelinghuysen was awarded the Frederic E. Church Award for contributions to American Culture. Most recently, she was the lead curator of the exhibition, *Artistic Furniture of the Gilded Age*, and co-author of its accompanying publication. She is currently working on a book on the Robert A. Ellison Jr. Collection of American Art Pottery.

Wednesday, April 19

Depart on an overnight flight from the U.S.A. to Amsterdam.

Amsterdam, The Netherlands

Thursday, April 20

In this vibrant city of harbors and canals, embark *AmaPrima* in the late afternoon. The captain hosts a welcome reception this evening.

Rotterdam, Kinderdijk, or Delft, The Netherlands

Friday, April 21

Rotterdam, largely rebuilt after World War II, is justly famous for its cutting-edge architecture by Renzo Piano, Piet Blom, Rem Koolhaas, and others. Tour the city this morning. Alternatively, journey across the reclaimed polder to see the beautifully preserved, 18thcentury windmills of Kinderdijk, or explore Delft, where artist Johannes Vermeer lived and worked for most of his life. Return to *AmaPrima* for lunch. This afternoon, attend a lecture or simply relax and enjoy the scenery as we cruise to Middleburg. B, L, D

Middleburg / Ghent, Belgium

Saturday, April 22

Stroll to the Zeeuws Museum, housed in an imposing 12th-century abbey in the center of Middleburg—once one of Holland's most important cities. Then travel by motorcoach to the medieval center of Ghent. Visit the Gothic Cathedral of St. Bavo for a tour, including a viewing of its greatest treasure, *Adoration of the Mystic Lamb* by Hubert and Jan Van Eyck. B, L, D

Bruges, Belgium Sunday, April 23

Today discover Bruges, a medieval gem laced with canals and gardens. Visit the Church of Our Lady, with its celebrated marble *Madonna and Child* by Michelangelo, and the Hans Memling Museum, whose treasures are on display in an old infirmary. After lunch at the canal-side Duc de Bourgogne, see Flemish masters and Renaissance art at the Groeninge Museum. This evening enjoy an onboard concert by one of Europe's renowned quartets. B, L, D

Antwerp, Belgium

Monday, April 24

Charming Antwerp is known for its soaring Gothic cathedral, displaying four paintings by local artist Peter Paul Rubens, including two magnificent altars. Visit the Rockox House, a gem of a museum set in the home of a 17th-century lawyer and art collector, when it is closed to the public. Enjoy free time to explore this port city, with its cobbled lanes, guild houses, and shops. Later this afternoon, cruise through scenic central Holland. B, L, D

Arnhem, The Netherlands Tuesday, April 25

From Arnhem, drive into the Hoge Veluwe National Park, whose moors, forests, and open fields are often depicted in Van Gogh's drawings and paintings. Inside the park, experience the Kröller-Müller Museum, a treasure house of modern art with a sculpture park that art critic John Russell called "still the best of its kind in the world." Afternoon options include a visit to the Airborne Museum Hartenstein in nearby Oosterbeck, or additional time at Hoge Veluwe. Celebrate a memorable voyage tonight at a farewell dinner hosted by the captain. B, L, D

Amsterdam

Wednesday, April 26

Cruise into Amsterdam, where AmaPrima remains overnight. Board chartered canal boats and cruise the city's ring of canals to see architectural wonders. Also visit the Rijksmuseum, home to Rembrandt's *The Night Watch* and other iconic paintings of the Dutch Golden Age. The remainder of the afternoon is at leisure, perhaps to visit the newly expanded Van Gogh Museum. Tomorrow is King's Day and exuberant festivities are already underway throughout the city. Alternatively, join an optional excursion to Keukenhof Gardens, where more than 7 million bulbs bloom each spring. B, L, D






Chef's Table restaurant
