Egypt & the Nile: A Journey into Antiquity Aboard Sanctuary Nile Adventurer

Dear Members and Friends of The Metropolitan Museum of Art,

The ancient land of Egypt has enthralled travelers for centuries. No one can fail to be moved by the Great Pyramids, the tombs and temples of Luxor, or the majestic Nile River. Add the dynamic city of Cairo, special entrée to archaeological sites, and a wonderful, four-night Nile River expedition aboard the deluxe Sanctuary Nile Adventurer, and you have an unforgettable experience.

Cairo's luxurious St. Regis Hotel will provide a wonderful home base from which to explore the Egyptian capital and surrounding cities. Of course, we will see the magnificent Great Pyramids up close and venture beyond the crowd barriers for exclusive access to the Great Sphinx. I'm excited to introduce you to Cairo's National Museum of Egyptian Civilization, which opened in 2021 as the new permanent home of Egypt's ancient kings. In nearby Sakkara, we will enjoy special access to the reopened underground apartments of Egypt's oldest pyramid, followed by a private visit to the 4,400-year-old tomb of the priest Wahtye, newly uncovered in 2018, with its beautiful hieroglyphs, statues, and reliefs.

We will fly by private jet to Luxor for an overnight stay at the Hilton Luxor Resort & Spa. Amidst Luxor's ancient temples gleaming in the sunlight, we'll feel the majesty of ancient Egypt at its height. We'll cross the Nile to explore the tombs of the Valley of the Kings, and we have arranged exclusive access to Queen Nefertari's strikingly adorned tomb, whose vividly colorful wall paintings have been meticulously preserved.

Our four-night Nile River voyage awaits aboard the elegant Sanctuary Nile Adventurer. The ancient world comes to life as we cruise down this legendary river. Highlights include visits to the miraculously preserved Temple of Horus at Edfu, the Ptolemaic temple at Kom Ombo, and the enchanting island Temple of Philae. 










Departure

Sunday, December 29

Depart on an overnight flight to Cairo.

Cairo, Egypt

Monday, December 30

Arrive in Cairo this afternoon and transfer to the elegant St. Regis, our home for the next four nights. After introductory remarks from Christopher Noey, mingle at the welcome reception.

Cairo / Giza

Tuesday, December 31

On New Year's Eve, start with an exclusive guided tour of the legendary Great Pyramids. At the Great Sphinx, venture beyond the protective crowd barriers for exclusive access to this colossal masterpiece, which stands 66 feet tall and extends more than 240 feet long. This evening, celebrate the arrival of 2025 in style at a joyous dinner.

Cairo

Wednesday, January 1

Enjoy a guided morning tour of the National Museum of Egyptian Civilization, the permanent home of Egypt's famous ancient kings, which opened in 2021. Marvel at its vast collection spanning 7,000 years of Egyptian history. Gain special access to the museum's restoration

center to witness the meticulous care that goes into preserving ancient artifacts. After lunch, head to Ibn Tulun Square for an expert-led tour of Islamic Cairo, including stops at the Gayer-Anderson Museum, which houses a collection of treasures from ancient Egypt, the Islamic world, and China; the ninth-century Ibn Tulun Mosque, one of Egypt's best-preserved mosques; and/or the splendid Sultan Hassan Mosque, a Mamlukera wonder known for its intricate calligraphy and tranquil courtyard.

Cairo / Sakkara

Thursday, January 2

Discover the eagerly anticipated Grand Egyptian Museum with an expert guide (pending opening). Here, admire the world's largest collection of ancient Egyptian artifacts, including many never exhibited before, and the complete collection of Tutankhamun treasures, featuring more than 7,000 pieces. After lunch, continue to Sakkara and the Step Pyramid of King Djoser, Egypt's oldest pyramid. Designed by Imhotep, the world's first recorded architect, in the 27th century B.C., this structure stands nearly 200 feet tall. Gain exclusive access to the labyrinthine burial chambers beneath the pyramid's base.

Enjoy special access to the tomb of Wahtye, a prominent priest from the Old Kingdom's Fifth Dynasty around 2450 B.C. Discovered in 2018, the complex boasts an ornate, aboveground chapel adorned with painted reliefs, inscriptions, and statues. Richly colored hieroglyphs and an assembly of 55 statues populate the tomb, giving insights into the beliefs and aspirations of the elite class during this era. Dinner is at your leisure. B,L

Cairo / Luxor

Friday, January 3

Board a privately chartered flight to Luxor, known as the "World's Largest Outdoor Museum." Check into the Hilton Luxor Resort & Spa for an overnight stay. This afternoon, walk along the recently reopened Avenue of Sphinxes, connecting the elegant Luxor Temple to the great Karnak Temple, and gaze upon the massive columns of its Hypostyle Hall. This evening, gather with your fellow travelers for dinner.

Luxor / Embark Sanctuary Nile Adventurer

Saturday, January 4

Join experts for an exclusive tour of the West Bank's archaeological wonders, including the expansive ancient Thebes necropolis and the Valley of the Queens, the eternal resting place of pharaohs' wives. Delight in rare private access to Queen Nefertari's tomb, the "Sistine Chapel of Ancient Egypt," where entry has been limited to preserve its vividly colorful paintings. Afterwards, marvel at the twin Colossi of Memnon, 70-foot-tall statues of Pharaoh Amenhotep III dating back to 1350 B.C. Step aboard the privately chartered Sanctuary Nile Adventurer and enjoy lunch. This afternoon, explore the outstanding collection at the Luxor Museum, which exhibits treasures from the Thebes necropolis, including exceptionally well-preserved statues unearthed in the late 20th century. Savor dinner on the ship this evening. B.L.D

Luxor

Sunday, January 5

Early this morning, return to the West Bank. Explore the tomb of Tutankhamun, the famous boy pharaoh, in the Valley of the Kings, the prestigious burial site of pharaohs, queens, and high-ranking officials during the New Kingdom. Take an inside look at the beautiful temple of Queen Hatshepsut at Deir el-Bahari, whose walls are covered with lovely painted reliefs depicting temple rituals and religious festivals. Return to the ship for lunch, and enjoy a leisurely afternoon. Delight in an inside look at the sprawling Luxor Temple as the sun's fading light illuminates its sandstone columns and carved hieroglyphs.

Edfu / Kom Ombo

Monday, January 6

Go behind the scenes of Egypt's Greco-Roman marvels, beginning in Edfu. Explore the monumental Temple of Horus, its intact walls covered in hieroglyphs and scenes depicting the revered falcon god. After lunch on board, arrive at the one-of-a-kind double Temple of Kom Ombo. Admire its perfectly symmetrical Greco-Roman design and its beautifully carved reliefs fusing Egyptian, Greek, and Roman styles. Partake in a festive Egyptian dinner this evening.

Aswan

Tuesday, January 7

In Aswan, take local boats to reach the Temple of Philae, built for the great goddess Isis and relocated due to the rising flood waters of the Nile. Then see an unfinished obelisk at the ancient stone quarries. After lunch, you may wish to relax on board. Alternatively, visit the Nubian Museum, which features landscaped gardens, artificial lakes, and more than 3,000 objects going as far back as 3500 B.C. that tell the full story of Nubian culture. Tonight, enjoy a festive farewell aboard the ship.

Aswan / Disembark / Abu Simbel / Cairo

Wednesday, January 8

Depart for the airport this morning to board a privately chartered flight to Abu Simbel. See the massive, rock-cut temples of Ramesses II and his favorite wife, Queen Nefertari. Constructed in the 13th century B.C., the temples were buried in the sand for centuries and rediscovered at the start of the 19th century. They were relocated in the 1960s to save them from submersion after the building of the High Dam. Continue by private plane to Cairo and and check back in at the St. Regis for a final night. Gather this evening for dinner at the hotel. B,L,D

Cairo / Return

Thursday, January 9

Depart the hotel early this morning and transfer to the airport for your flights home. R


